

If you like great entertainment, good food, and a venue within walking distance of the trade show and your hotels, then you will love the OFMA 100-Year Anniversary Celebration. What a great way to start the new year!

The marquee evening is set for Friday, January 3, 2025 in Exhibit Hall A at the Columbus Convention Center. Exhibit Hall A is one of the newest and largest venues in Columbus. The evening:

- 1. Doors Open a 5PM with a delicious Western BBQ dinner ending at 7PM. Included Ice tea, water, coffee, and Dessert Bar.
- 2. Amusement rides supplied by Kissel Amusements, Durant Amusements and Lisko Family Amusements will provide free rides 4-7:45PM and then after the concert till 11PM.


Kathy Parry to provide two dynamic sessions at this year's convention Robert Dawson Treasurer OFMA
